





USDA: A Brief History











FSA Farm Loan Options

FSA Loan Assistance Tool

	Operating Loans	Farm Ownership Loans
Direct Loans	 Direct Operating Loan (OL) Limit: \$400K Typically one-year terms but can be up to 7 years for longer term things/larger purchases (such as equipment, minor repairs, or livestock) 	Direct Farm Ownership Loan (FO)Limit: \$600K40 years maximum term
Guaranteed Loans	 Guaranteed Operating Loan (OL) Limit: \$2,251,000 Typically one-year terms, but can be up to 7 years for longer term things/larger purchases (such as equipment, minor repairs, or livestock) 	 Guaranteed Farm Ownership Loan (FO) Limit: \$2,251,000 40 years maximum term



USDA Changes

- Congress: passes laws ("authorizes") about programs and funding. Laws have variable levels of detail.
- USDA (and other agencies of the executive branch, aka administration)
 implements those laws, writing rules to guide implementation and handbooks
 to instruct agency staff
- New programs, new rules, and changes in how things are done are constant;
 direct service providers should stay current to help guide farmers through changes that may impact them.

USDA Changes

- Reductions in Force (RIFs) and Reorganization
 - Sec. Rollins' July 24, 2025 Memorandum
 - Comment Period open through September 30th
- Funding
- July 10th Final Rule regarding the "socially disadvantaged" designation
